Millard was born Feb. 7, 1845, in Rochester, Monroe County, New York, son of a father born in Mass. and a mother born in New York. He came with his parents to Wisconsin, in 1848 when only three years of age. He died Feb. 23, 1903, in Cumberland, aged 58 years and 16 days. His military style gravestone is inscribed "Mill'd Boyden Co. A. 3 Wis. Inf." Millard was a pension attorney at the time of his death and had assisted many Civil War veterans in
