Tuscania Sinking...

At 5 O'Clock I had gone down to shave for dinner, which was at seven. After shaving, I laid down in my berth and talked about our trip with three other officers. I think we were talking about sending a cable home in the morning. One officer said, "You better wait until we get into France." I pulled out my watch to check the time and Just as I put the watch back into my pocket, we felt something hit the boat.
 The boat shook like a leaf, followed by a dull thud and the crashing of glass and wood. The lights went out and the shock threw me out of my bunk and on the floor. I will never forget the feeling that came over me when I realized what happened.
 I reached for my flashlight, found it under my pillow and turned it on. By the aid of it, I found my coat, overcoat, and life belt. I put them on and rushed to my station on deck. I found most of my men lined up to get into life boats, but there was a delay in lowering them. We got three away and then the ropes broke. We stood there for two hours, with every boat gone, waiting for the big boat to sink.
 I never in my life saw such a display of coolness, as not a complaint was heard. Some smoked, while others told stories and all the time the boat was sinking. At 7:30 pm, a big torpedo boat showed up. How the men cheered as it ran alongside us.
 We threw ropes over and slid down onto her feet first, head first, or anyway we could get there. Every man left on the boat was taken off that way. They took us to a town in Ireland and put us up there for the night. I never was so glad to see dry land.
 Right here, I want to say a word about the English army. Never have I seen people like them. They gave us everything we wanted and nothing was too good for us. Men and officers got up and turned out to take care of the sick and wounded. They have hearts as big as houses and they deserve a gold medal, every one of them.
 I cannot tell you about he losses, but I suppose by the time this letter reaches you, they will have been published in the papers. I have some of my Company here

and understand others will be coming in the morning. Such is the fate of war.
 We are in a rest camp in England and I suppose we will stay here until the Company gets fitted again. I wish they would hurry for we are anxious to get revenge. The grounds are so small here we have no drilling. All men have is an eight mile hike each day.
 We have seen no sugar or milk, only a substitute for coffee since we landed. Tobacco is sky high and cigars like hen's teeth to find. When you do find one, it cost a small fortune. I went over to town the other day and saw a real egg and it was 10 cents, not for a dozen, but 10 cents each.
 I do not know how much I can tell you. I want this letter to go through and I do not want to say anything in it that is forbidden by the censors. All I can tell has been published in English papers and I know of no reason it should not go through."

 Lee M. Boyden would survive the war and return home. He would later move to California and live to the age of 88. His parent's both stayed in Cumberland and were buried here. The local American Legion, meanwhile, would honor the first Cumberland serviceman to lose his life in World War I, Homer L. Anderson, by naming the Post after him.
 For those reading the story as told by Lt. Boyden, we have another reason to count our blessing for the brave men who have served our country in time of war.
 On November 29, 1874, Millard married Albertha J. Grant in Blue Earth County, Minnesota. Albertha was born June 22, 1851, in New Brunswick, Canada, daughter of John Grant and Hannah Miller, both natives of that country. She died March 9, 1948, at the home of her daughter Bertha at St. Paul, Minn., aged 96 years, 8 months and 17 days. Her remains were returned to Cumberland and buried beside those of her husband in Lakeside Cemetery. Their children, three sons and two daughters, of whom the first four were born in Minnesota, were:
 William Jay, b. 1 Jul 1877

 Lee Morton, b. 26 Mar 1889, in Cumberland, Wis.
 Millard was born Feb. 7, 1845, in Rochester, Monroe County, New York, son of a father born in Mass. and a mother born in New York. He came with his parents to Wisconsin, in 1848 when only three years of age. He died Feb. 23, 1903, in Cumberland, aged 58 years and 16 days. His military style gravestone is inscribed "Mill'd Boyden Co. A. 3 Wis. Inf." Millard was a pension attorney at the time of his death and had assisted many Civil War veterans in obtaining their pensions.
