contest, in which the sophomore girls played a team of junior girls. The paper said the score of the contest ended "Nothing to zero."
 The girls continued to play and improve in the sport, including a six-game schedule in 1923. Gladys Knutson, Minnie Flottum, and Sarah Kunselman led a squad that went 3 and 3, including a 6-1 victory over Spooner.
 In 1938, a name that would become part of Cumberland Basketball for the next 30 years would help the Beavers Boys capture a Conference Title and a trip to State. First year coach Elmer Beran's Beavers squad secured the HON Championship with a 31-30 win over Rice Lake.
 The team, complete with seven seniors, would then advance to the Class B State Tournament, with a 27-22 victory over Hurley at the District level. The Beavers were led by the scoring combination of Hodson and Alphonse as local adults payed 60 cents each to attend the contest.
 The team left for Madison on Monday, picked up two hitch-hikers along the way, and stopped in Black River Falls for lunch before landing in the Capitol City. In Madison, the Beavers would lose 25-10 to River Falls, defeat New London 25-22, and lose the Consolation to Evansville by a 22-20 score.
 A welcome home Banquet for the team was held by the Cumberland Civic Club following the State Tournament. There, they presented an electric razor to Coach Beran in appreciation of his efforts.
 The Varsity wasn't the only Cumberland team in action that winter. The 1938 FFA Basketball team won a six-team Tournament in Shell Lake as Mike Zaccardi led the team in scoring. Basketball was enjoying great popularity in town at all levels.
 The next 30-years would become the zenith of Boys basketball in the Cumberland. With basketball hoops common place in driveways around the city, names like Conway Thompson, Jim Wallin, Roger Peterson, John Schell, Mark Nelson, Steve King, Carroll Schell, Steve Helbig, Dick Nelson, and many, many others would help lead the Beavers to numerous Conference Titles and State Tournament appearances in 1941, 1965, and 1971.
 The WIAA would then finally add Girls Basketball as a sponsored sport in 1975. Led by Mary and Sue Linder, that first Cumberland squad would put together a 11-6 record. That year would be followed by several excellent seasons that included 16 wins in 1990-191 and 17 wins by the 1993-1994 team. Kay Anderson became a 1,000-point scorer and basketball fans had another place to go on Tuesday and Friday nights.
 Yes, today, the players travel much differently, get three-points for longer shots, play halves instead of quarters, and spend less time on the block than their predecessors. Basketball is still a great game, however, and its role in the Island City continues.
